## **SHOWING REGULATIONS**

- 1. Exhibitor** - You will need to provide the Ashby de la Zouch & District Agricultural Society with certain personal information relating to you. Your privacy is extremely important to us and so we want you to know exactly how we will use that personal information. Our full privacy notice setting out detailed information about matters such as personal information we use, for what purpose we use it, what our legal basis for doing so is and who we share it with can be viewed on our website [www.ashbyshow.com](http://www.ashbyshow.com). The booking of your class entry to this show will show you agree to this notice.
- 2. Ownership** - All classes in this schedule are open to exhibitors residing in any part of the United Kingdom. Exhibits in all classes must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor and must be in their ownership at the date of the Show. The exhibitor's name(s) on the Show entry form must be the same as on the animal registration certificate. In the event of the death of an exhibitor between the date of entry and the date of the Show, the executors of the deceased will be deemed to be the exhibitor.
- 3. Entries** - All entries should be on the form supplied and should be signed by the exhibitor or his agent. This entry form, together with all entry fees (and subscriptions, if not already paid) must be received by the Secretary not later than the closing date if classes request. Late entries may not be accepted. The entry fee for any animal entered but not exhibited will be forfeited (except as provided for under British Showjumping Rules). Unaccompanied Competitors must provide the Show Organiser a contact telephone number in case of an emergency.
- 4. Nominations of Entries** - The name of the exhibit and all relevant details must be stated on the entry form Except in the case of Showjumping and Side-Saddle classes.
- 5. Cancellation of Classes** - The Society reserves the right to amalgamate or cancel classes or sections in the event of there being insufficient entries. Entry fees for classes cancelled by the Society will be refunded.
- 6. Admission** - Admission to the Show will be by Vehicle Pass, colour coded for the appropriate entrance and fixed to the windscreen in a prominent position, and admission tickets sent with exhibitors numbers depending on the number of animals exhibited. Tickets for livestock and horse competitors will be allocated as follows:  
**1-3 animals - 2 tickets      4 animals and over - 3 tickets**  
Extra persons will be expected to pay for admission and Stewards may inspect vehicles.  
**All exhibitors should be on the Showground at least half an hour before the stated judging time for their respective classes. EXHIBITORS ARE RECOMMENDED TO ARRIVE EARLIER TO AVOID TRAFFIC CONGESTION AT THE ENTRANCE GATES.**
- 7. Veterinary** - The Society's veterinary surgeons are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to the Showground suspected of being infected with a contagious or infectious disease or with a disease or injury which, in their opinion renders it unfit or unsafe to be exhibited. Such an animal will not be allowed to compete. The exhibitor will be held entirely responsible by the Society for any circumstances which may result from the appearance of such an animal on the Showground. The Society reserves the right to take blood samples from any animal which the Judge and/or Stewards suspect may have been dosed with illegal substances. A horse ambulance will be in attendance.
- 8. Identification** - Exhibits shall be identified by the numbers issued by the Secretary.
- 9. Judging** - The Society reserves the right to appoint a substitute should any judge be prevented from attending the Show and all entries are accepted on this understanding. Times of judging, as stated in this Schedule, will be adhered to as strictly as possible but are subject to alteration. Exhibitors must be ready to enter the ring at once when called upon by the Stewards. A public address system will be used to advise horse and pony competitors to be ready but it is SOLELY THE COMPETITORS RESPONSIBILITY to be in the ring in time for their class.

**10. Horse Height** - Where the height of the horse or pony is specified in any class, the Judge or Steward may require such animals entered in the class to be measured, unless the animal has an official measurement certificate, issued by the Joint Measurement Scheme. Half an inch will be allowed for normal shoes.

**11. Age** - Riders aged 18 yrs and under on the day of the Show, must state their date of birth on the entry form.

**12. Safety** - All animals must be secured by halter or other means, except as required at the time of judging. Unruly and fractious animals may be refused admission to the rings by the Stewards. Exercising of horses and ponies will only be allowed in the designated exercise areas. Anyone riding a horse or pony anywhere on the Showground must wear a hat, of a standard approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting and properly fastened. The attention of all exhibitors is drawn to the Society's Policy, a copy of which may be seen at the Secretary's marquee.

**13. Conduct** - The Council may at any time, before or during the Show, reject any entry, whether the same has been accepted or not, without giving, reasons and their decision shall be final. The Council also has the power to eject from the Showground any commercial photographers, or persons whose behaviour they consider to be objectionable. All dogs on the Showground must be kept on leads at all times, except when being exhibited.

**14. Dress** - Exhibitors of horses and ponies, grooms and attendants must wear correct dress, as approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting.

**15. Objections** - Any exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection must do so in writing and must deliver it to the Secretary within an hour of the Judge's decision being given. Such objections must be accompanied by a deposit of £20 and will be considered by the Council and their decision shall be final. The deposit will be returned if the objection is sustained.

**16. Prize Money** - Following the judge's decision in each class, winning exhibitors will be handed vouchers for their prize money. Prize money will be paid at the Show Jumping marquee, on presentation of prize money vouchers, except where an objection has been lodged but not yet resolved. Please note that all prize money not collected on the day will be forfeited.

**17. Trophies** - All trophies will be available for collection at the Show Jumping Marquee after each class has finished. They will be held by the winner for one year but will remain the property of the Society and must be returned as directed by the Secretary.

18. Missed Class.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that they arrive at the start of their classes on time. No refunds will be given if classes are missed.

**19. Responsibility** - The Society, its Officers and Staff, disclaim any responsibility and all liability in respect of any accident, damage, injury, disease or loss, howsoever caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant, or the general public, or to any animal, article, vehicle or property brought on to the Showground, or while entering or leaving the Showground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article, vehicle or property, exhibited or brought on to the Showground by him. He shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of, or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.

**20. Other Regulations** - Any person, competing shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of that society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including any disciplinary procedures) insofar as they are applicable to the Show.

**21. Interpretation** - Anything not provided for in the foregoing shall be decided by the Society's Council, whose decision shall be final and binding. On the day of the Show, the Chairman shall have all the powers of the Council under these regulations.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. The Society is affiliated to British Showjumping and all competitors in the show jumping classes shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of British Showjumping.
2. Entries in all show jumping classes are restricted to horses registered with British Showjumping and must be ridden by British Showjumping members, in accordance with British Showjumping Rules 77 & 79.
3. Owners entering their horses do so entirely at their own risk and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the British Showjumping, it's Committees or Officers, nor to the Society, it's Council or staff, in any respect whatsoever.
4. Competitors must wear the correct dress and use the correct saddlery and equipment in accordance with British Showjumping Rules 101 & 102.
5. Cancellation of Entries: 50% of entry fees will be refunded in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79(4).
6. In the event of insufficient starters in any class, lower prizes may be withheld in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 76.6.
7. The Council of the Ashby-de-la-Zouch & District Agricultural Society Ltd reserves the right to refuse any entry, without obligation to give the reason for such refusal.
8. No member shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete, in any show jumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure other members of the public are not put at risk of injury, in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 82.21.
9. Riders who cannot fully satisfy the conditions laid down in Rule 77.1 must present an entry ticket, conforming to the 'Ticket to Ride' scheme laid down in Rule 77.2. One ticket/class.

### **Tickets for competitors will be allocated as follows:-**

- 1 - 3 horses - 2 tickets**  
**4 horses & over - 3 tickets**

# SENIOR SHOWJUMPING

**Start 8.30 a.m. prompt in the Showjumping Ring.**

**Please could all competitors in Classes 1 & 2 declare with the Collecting Ring Steward by the end of the course walk. If you do not declare, we will presume that you are not on the showground and you may miss your class.**

**Entries for classes 1 & 2 close on Thursday, 12th July. Drawn Order will be available on Saturday, 14th July. Entries may possibly be accepted before 9am on the day providing that the number of pre-entries for each class are less than 60. Any entries taken on the day in these classes must compete first in the drawn order. Once entries reach 60 these classes will be closed.**

## **CLASS 1 - Senior 90cm Open**

For registered horses in Grades A, B & C. Ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members who will be aged 12 years or over in the current calendar year.

Pre-entries may possibly be accepted before 9.00am providing that the number of entries are less than 60. Once entries reach 60 before 9.00am the class will be closed. Any entries taken on the day must compete first in the drawn order.

### **Rule 290.15 - Pre-Entry & Drawn Order**

Table A8 - speed 325mpm - Rule 317 Start Height 1.00m

Entry Fee: £20.00

Prize Money: £100 £75 £50 £35 £20 £20

For registered horses that have qualified to compete by jumping double clear rounds in at least four KBIS Insurance British Novice Championship First Round Competitions in accordance with Rule 316.6. To be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members. Riders who have ever competed as a team member of any Senior International Team (4\* or 5\* Nations Cup in the last 10 years, World, European Championships & Olympic Games) are not eligible.

There will be 12 Second Round competitions (subject to revision) Qualified horses are eligible to be entered to compete in any four of the 12 Second Round competitions.

Qualifies for the British Showjumping National Championships

Numbers to qualify: One with up to 25 starters, Two with 26 - 50 starters and 3 with 51 or more starters. Plus those horses that jump clear in all three rounds of a British Novice Second Round competition.

## **CLASS 3 - Connolly's RED MILLS Senior Newcomers - First Round/1.10m Open**

Two Phase - speed 325mpm Rule 312 Start Height 1.10m

Entry Fee: £15

Prize Money: £40 £30 £23 £15 £15

First place rosette kindly sponsored by Connolly's RED MILLS. In the event of 30 or more starters, the class will be split and two sets of prize money awarded. Horses may only compete in one section.

**Newcomers:**

(a) For registered horses in Grade C, not to have won a total of 375 points. Four double clears will qualify - in accordance with rule 312.6.

(b) For all registered horses born on or after 1st January 2012, irrespective of points. Horses will only be eligible for double clear qualification to Second Rounds if they reach the age of six years or under in the same calendar year as the Newcomers Final - in accordance with rule 312.6.

Four double clears will qualify for the Senior Newcomers Second Round. Qualifying period 1st June - 31st May inclusive.

**1.10m Open:**

For registered horses ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

Table A Rule 274 - speed 375mpm

Start Height 1.15m - 1.30m Joker Fence - 1.45m

Entry Fee: £30.00

Prize Money: £500 £400 £300 £200 £100 £30

**Limited to 30 Entries - Drawn Order**

This competition takes place over eight obstacles which are progressively more difficult. No combination obstacles are allowed. The progressive difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles but also to the difficulty of the track.

Points are awarded as follows:

One point for obstacle No 1 cleared, two points for No 2, three points for No 3 etc, with a total of 36 points.

No point is awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Faults other than knock-downs are penalized as for Table A and any of these faults, including time faults are converted into points and deducted from any jumping points scored.

In the event of equality of points for first place, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a shortened course, over obstacles that may be increased in height and/or spread. The obstacles in the jump-off must be jumped in the same order as in the first round and retain their respective points allotted in the first round.

This competition may also take place directly against the clock.

For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle may be provided, of which one part may be designated the Joker. The Joker must be more difficult than the alternative obstacle and carry double points. If the Joker is knocked down, the points must be deducted from the total.

Due to this class being limited to 30 entries, riders will only be able to enter one horse. Please book early with payment on line or at the show office. Entries will not be accepted via social media!

Two Phase – speed 350mpm - Rule 310 Height of fences:- 1.20m

Entry Fee: £16.00

Prize Money: £50 £40 £30 £18 £16

First place rosette kindly sponsored by Equitop Myoplast.

In the event of 30 or more starters this class will be split and two sets of prize money awarded. Horses may only compete in one section.

Foxhunter Section:

(a) For registered horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 700 points. Four double clears will qualify - in accordance with rule 310.6.

(b) For all registered horses born on or after 1 January, 2011, irrespective of points. Horses will be eligible for double clear qualification to attend second rounds, providing they reach the age of seven years or under in the same calendar year as the Foxhunter Final - in accordance with rule 310.6. Four double clears will qualify.

Four double clears will qualify for the Senior Foxhunter Second Rounds. Qualifying period - 1 June - 31 May inclusive.

Those horses that have qualified for the Senior Foxhunter Championship in 2018 are not eligible for qualification to the 2019 Championship.

Open Section:

For registered horses ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

Horses will be permitted to jump in the larger section of the handicap competition without penalty. Horses may only compete in one section.

Qualifies for the British Showjumping National Championships. Qualifying period: 1 July - 30 June. Two Double Clears to qualify (subject to revision).
